Elaine Barber enjoyed attending the World Harp Congress in Vancouver, B.C. in July with fellow Austin area harpists Delaine Fedson and Gretchen Williams. The Austin Chamber Ensemble will present Barber's Trio Copine (with Barb Mahler, flute and Martha Carapetyan, viola), along with soprano Claire Vangelisti, in a pair of house concerts in October featuring the music of Debussy, Bax, Nathan Currier and Peter Schickele. Next May she will play the premiere performance and recording of a new work by Stephen Barber for the chamber group Revel.

Barber student Jessica Wiedemeier was featured in Austin Youth Orchestra's performance of Vivaldi's *Concerto in D* in May, and will be featured performing Linda Wood's *Two Guitars* in December.

#### • From the studio of Delaine Fedson

In June, 2010, the UT Harp Ensemble performed at the AHS Summer Institute in Denton, TX, and Delaine Fedson and Elaine Barber collaborated with Catherine Anderson at the "Working With Composers" workshop at the Summer Institute. Delaine and Elaine premiered two of James Sclater's new works for duo harp: *I Woke Up This Mornin'*, and *Brazilian Dance Suite*.

Two of Fedson's students participated in the finals of the AHS National Competition: Suzuki student Amy Buescher in Intermediate II, and UT Student Emily Melendes in the Advanced Division. Emily Melendes also spent her summer as the harpist and assistant librarian at the Breckenridge Music Festival.

Fedson's students Amy Frazier and Amy Buescher played in Isabelle Perrin's master class on the music of Bernard Andres at World Harp Congress in Vancouver, B.C. in July.

This summer Delaine Fedson directed the Longhorn Harp Camp at the University of Texas at Austin for the 10th year in a row with Kela Walton as this year's guest harp and yoga instructor. The camp encourages young harpists in their development as performers with a focus on ensemble performance and care of their bodies as musicians. Fedson also taught Suzuki Teacher Development classes at Peaks to Plains Suzuki Institute in CO, and the American Suzuki Institute at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point.

Kela Walton & Jacquelyn Venter co-directed the 2nd Annual Round Rock ISD Harp Ensemble Festival. 

She also played two concerts with the Roswell Symphony during the 2010-2011 season, as well as numerous receptions, including the American Cancer Society and Cancer Survivors, etc.


Greetings Fellow Harpists and Friends of the Harp,
