

ANNE ADAMS AWARDS 2024 WINNER

Chaela Franck, a student of Gretchen Van Hoesen at Carnegie Melon University.

In 1990 as a tribute to his wife, Anne Adams, Dr. Burton Adams founded the Anne Adams Fund with the mission of furthering the development of future professional harpists. In honor of Anne Adams, these awards have always included an orchestra, ballet, or opera excerpt in addition to the required solo repertoire.

An award of \$3,000 for full-time study of the harp is given to the winner, thanks to the generous support from the Anne Adams Fund, The Sally Maxwell/Doris Calkins Fund, and the Jack/Doris Nebergall Funds.

GRANDJANY MEMORIAL COMPETITION 2024 WINNERS

Hallie Bentschneider, student of Carol McClure at The Harp School, Inc. UK Conservatory Program and Can Yang Zi Quan (known as Sunshine), student of Kathleen Bride at the Eastman School of Music.

The **Grandjany Memorial winners** receive an award of \$3,500. This competition was established in 1979 by the American Harp Society and was funded by Bernard Grandjany in honor of his father Marcel Grandjany and was enhanced by bequests from Mary Wheeler and Hermine Herbring. Its administration was transferred to the American Harp Foundation in 1996.

HARP DISCOVERY DAY

On Saturday, June 15th, the Central Florida Chapter of the American Harp Society graciously hosted a free public "Harp Discovery Day" for the greater Orlando community. We are particularly grateful to the Elizabeth Morse Genius Foundation of Winter Park, Florida, who provided funding for the event as well as complimentary tickets to the Sunday evening concert for local jazz students.

In the morning, a panel including Stella Sung, Dan Crozier, Alex Burtzos, and Jan Jennings explored the Mysteries of Writing and Arranging for Harp. Invitees included members of the Central Florida Composers Forum, the Young Composer's Challenge, and composition students from the University of Central Florida, Rollins College, and local high schools.

The afternoon offered the public a chance to hear and learn about the harp – it's history, how it works, and a performance by the Chapter ensemble. The day wrapped up wrapped up with a delightful Harp Petting Zoo to offer hands-on opportunities to potential future harpists, on pedal and lever harps of all sizes.

Greetings from the Orlando Philharmonic Orchestra! We are excited to have so many of you here in our culturally rich community. The Philharmonic is currently completing its 31st season and as a resident company of the Dr. Phillips Center for the Performing Arts, we are proud to perform in the new Steinmetz Hall, one of the finest venues for acoustic music in the country. The Hall was also recently recognized by Architectural Digest as one of "The 11 Most Beautiful Theaters in the World." It's a truly spectacular space.

Our Vision is to enrich and inspire through the transformative power of live music as Central Florida's premiere professional orchestra. We do that by annually presenting the 10-concert Classics and Pops Series at Steinmetz as well as the chamber orchestra Focus Series, and Symphony Storytime Series at The Plaza Live, a historic Central Florida venue. We present more than 170 live concerts during our season and impact more than 70,000 elementary age students through our Young People's Concerts.

I am especially excited that we are a partner in commissioning a new piece for the harp, composed by Alex Burtzos, Endowed Chair of Composition Studies at the University of Central Florida. You will get to hear his piece at the Conference performed by members of the Philharmonic, and we will repeat it on our August concert at the Dr. Phillips Center.

2024 CHAPTER AMBASSADORS

In 2019, the AHS Board of Directors created the Chapter Ambassadors Program program to inspire student engagement with the AHS national events; to promote community; and to empower recipients to create engagement opportunities within local harp communities. Chapters were invited to nominate up to three students for this honor. Chapters raised funds in support of their students' attendance at the Summer Institute and AHS provided a match of up to \$500 per student.

This matching awards program is being presented as an opportunity for the national organization to encourage and support chapter initiatives that promote student participation in the National Event while simultaneously engaging the student ambassadors in learning about and participating in activities at the national level. Each Ambassador will complete a community engagement project within the next year, and share what they gained from their national event attendance with their local community.



REMEMBERING BERNARD GRANDJANY



Bernard Marcel Grandjany, son of the esteemed French harpist Marcel Grandjany and his wife Georgette, was born on April 29, 1930, in Paris, France, and passed away peacefully in Queens, NY, on February 24, 2024. His final act of kindness was to give the gift of life through organ and tissue donation, under the auspices of LiveOn NY.

Bernard's family, living in Paris, became wary of the dangerous political climate in Europe and emigrated to the United States in 1936, residing in New York City. In 1937 at the age of seven years, Bernard began the study of the harp with his father. In his words, "It was not to be," and his studies lasted only one month.

Bernard finished his schooling and began work with the American Red Cross. He rose through the ranks and eventually was appointed Assistant Director of Disaster Services in the greater New York area. He held this position for twenty-five years, retiring in 1981. Bernard, answering calls in the middle of the night, could be found at every fire, flood, and natural disaster affecting the citizens of New York City. He was tireless in his efforts to help those most impacted by disaster and loss. He was appointed Honorary Deputy Fire Chief with the Fire Department of New York in 1982 for services rendered to the City of New York by then Fire Commissioner Charles Hynes.

For many years Bernard escorted his mother and father on their annual summer trips driving throughout the United States, especially to see the natural beauty of the Western states. He developed a love of travel which continued in his retirement. He often took trips on ocean liners and rode trains across the United States and Canada to appreciate the natural beauty of both countries.

He was a member of The World Ship Society – Port of NY Branch, and The Steamship Historical Society of America.

Bernard lived in retirement in Rego Park, NY, and continued to attend harp-related events and concerts in the NYC area and to speak to American Harp Society chapters about his father, Marcel Grandjany, one of the founders of AHS. A Mass of Christian Burial was held on Thursday, February 29, 2024 at 10:30 am at Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal Catholic Church, Ridgewood, New York, with interment alongside his parents immediately following in the Gate of Heaven Cemetery, Hawthorne, New York. Bernard was a donor to and Honorary Life Member of AHS, and contributions may be made in his memory at www.harpsociety.org or PO Box 47, Granby, MA 01033.

Dear Harpists,

The Central Florida Chapter of the American Harp Society is excited to welcome you to Orlando to attend the 2024 45th American Harp Society National Conference.

Our Chapter has been in existence since 1987 and was started by Central Florida Harpist, Jan Jennings. For 30+ years, Jan has been the champion and cheerleader of our Chapter, planning annual harp workshops featuring nationally known clinicians, organizing many Chapter ensemble concerts, and planning concerts for visiting harpists. You will see her in action during the Conference as she leads our Central Florida Chapter Ensemble and the Sunshine Harp Ensemble. If you happen to speak with Jan, please thank her for her service to the harp world.

Orlando is known worldwide for its theme park attractions, especially the one inspired by the Mouse!! And in the 33 years I've been a resident here, the Greater Orlando region has expanded its cultural and performing arts footprint exponentially.

Our community's most life-changing "performing arts moment" was the 2014 opening of the Dr. Phillips Center for the Performing Arts. Included in the Center, at that time were the 2700-seat non-acoustic Walt Disney Hall and the 300-seat Pugh Theater.

Then in January of 2022, Steinmetz Hall, a 1700-seat acoustically perfect hall, opened for Orchestral, Opera, and Ballet performances. Our now 31-year-old Orlando Philharmonic Orchestra is very excited to have this wonderful hall in which to perform. Most recently, in February 2024, Judson's Live, a 150-seat intimate space with a club-like atmosphere, opened to feature blues, jazz, Latin, and soul performers. Jazz Harpist Brandee Younger performed here in April 2024.

To complement our Conference offerings, the Elizabeth Morse Genius Foundation in Winter Park, Florida, awarded the Conference a grant to put together a "Harp Discovery Day" on Saturday, June 15. The goal of this Day was to promote the harp to the Greater Orlando community. It included two sessions: "Mysteries of Composing and Arranging for the Harp" and "You Can Play the Harp".

Thank you to all of you who volunteered to assist with the Conference. And while you are here, don't miss the "Harpists in a Pool" photo shoot. Wear your bathing suit as we fill the pool with harpists!

INSTRUMENT SECURITY

Conference registrants are welcome to keep personal harps in their hotel rooms, where practicing is allowed within reasonable hours. The Harp Pen is available for storage of Conference performer/presenter instruments in Longboat 2. The Harp Pen will be secure, monitored and/or locked 24 hours a day.

Harp owners loaning instruments to the Conference must sign a liability release form and receive a registration tag for each harp. Neither the AHS nor the Conference venues provides insurance for any harps, and are not liable for damages that may occur while at the Conference. Harps will be registered, labeled, and moved to the Harp Pen by their owner unless prior arrangements have been made with the Harp Pen Coordinator.

Instruments of participants in the Sunshine Harp Ensemble may be secured in Merritt Tuesday through Wednesday morning. Owners are responsible for moving their own instruments (see below).

Composer Johanny Navarro, celebrated for Afro-Caribbean-inspired creations, has enriched diverse musical entities, such as the Multicultural Music Group and Boston Opera Collaborative. Notably, she earned Opera America's Discovery Grant

in 2020 for ¿Y los Pasteles?, premiered in July 2022 in San Juan. A finalist in the Atlanta Opera's "96-Hour Opera Project" in 2022, she unveiled Atlanta: 1906. Currently, as a resident artist at the American Lyric Theater, New York, she premiered The Magic Cabbage in 2022 and collaborates on the comedic opera Working for the Macbeths (2023) with librettist Marcus Yi.



ANNE-MARIE O'FARRELL

Leading harpist of her generation, **Dr. Anne-Marie O'Farrell** has performed worldwide at international festivals, including several World Harp Congresses. She is particularly recognized for her levering innovations and ground-breaking expansion of harp repertoire. These are documented in her substantial publication output, including

critical editions of works by J.S. Bach. Highlight performances with BBC National Orchestra of Wales, RTÉ Concert Orchestra and National Symphony Orchestra of Ireland featured her as soloist in her lever harp concerto, *In Light Anew*. Originally from Richmond, VA, Charles Overton is a Boston-based harpist and improviser. Charles enjoys a career in classical music that includes frequent performances with the Boston Symphony, as well as regular chamber music performances with such

organizations as the Orpheus Chamber Orchestra and the Yellow Barn Summer Music Festival. As a jazz musician he performs internationally both as a band leader, and in collaboration with such artists as Shabaka Hutchings, Ganavya Doraiswamy, and Esperanza Spalding. Charles owes much of his outlook on music to his time spent learning from the renowned artist-faculty of the Berklee Global Jazz Institute. Overton serves on the faculty of the Boston Conservatory at Berklee.
