Who we are...

The IHA began with Samuel and Rosalie Pratt's exstensive donation of harp music and archival documents related to the harp. Thereafter, additional major donations arrived, including the Jack Nebergall collection and a major bequest from the Victor Salvi Foundation. In 1994, the International Harp Archives became the official host of the Archive of the American Harp Society.

In addition to the AHS Archive, the IHA also embraces materials from the World Harp Congress, and personal collections from individual harpists. Materials range from scores, manuscripts, and recordings to photographs, correspondence, programs, and other documents. Cur-

rently we have over 11,000 scores and sound recordings in addition to the archives.

The goal of the IHA is to build a nearcomprehensive collection of harp music and memorabilia related to the harp and the musicians who dedicated their lives to preserve and perpetuate the harp's history and to ensure Mildred Dilling collected harps from around the world. its future.

Accessing the Archives...

The International Harp Archives are divided primarily into two sections: non-circulating special collections and the general collection available through Interlibrary Loan. Here are some basic guidelines for searching our holdings.

The Harold B. Lee Library On-line Catalog

The online catalog contains records for all of our printed music, sound recordings, and books on the harp To search our collection, go to lib.byu.edu, click on 'Library Catalog' under the 'Unique Collections at BYU' header, and you will be directed to a simple keyword search.

Advanced Search Options:

- Enter the Library Catalog as indicated above.
- Select the "Advanced Keyword Search" option.
- In addition to Keywords such as composer names and titles, you can limit a search by format using the "Type" drop-down menu (note that the "Format" drop-down menu should not be used).
- Common "Type" delimiters include "Music Score," "Compact Disc," and "Record (LP)."
- To view a list of the major harp archives enter "Harp" as a keyword and "Music & Dance Archives" from the "Location" drop-down menu.

American Harp Society Lending Library

Because the AHS Lending Library is a service only available to AHS members, the Lending Library contents are not listed in the BYU Library Catalog. The AHS Lending Library, located in the Harold B. Lee Library, contains archive-quality recordings (both audio and audio-visual) of workshops and recitals from past American Harp Society conferences. Patrons may view them on-site at the Archives, or AHS members may request to borrow them through the mail. Requests for loans should be submitted via email to david day@byu.edu.


Accessing the Archives...

To borrow materials from he AHS Lending Library:

- 1. Use the Audio or Visual Recordings PDFs available at harp.byu. edu to determine which item(s) you wish to borrow.
- 2. Email your request to david_day@byu.edu.
- 3. There is a \$3.00 per item lending fee. An invoice will be sent to you with your requested materials.
- 4. After the allotted one (1) month lending period, patrons must return the item(s) either in person or through the mail.

Internet Archive

In a major effort to make our collections more accessible to the harp community, we have scanned more than 2,400 public domain scores and made them available through the Internet Archive. Go to http://archive.org and search for (byuinternationalharparchive), parentheses included, to access and download music from a large selection rare and manuscript scores.
